At the begging Milica Boskovic informed all partners that Christos El Khattab from CSI, reorganized TRUST Google Drive, by crating folders and subfolders for all WPs at project, and all activities and deliverables. The meeting had following Agenda:

1. International Conference

Milica Boskovic introduced actinities which have been down so far on organizing activity A1. 8 – regional conference. The Conference will have international character with 20 authors and articles, prepared following main aim and theme of this event: Transdisciplinarity of Security Studies and

Practice. The Conference will be held at faculty of Diplomacy and Security, Belgrade, on May 8-9 2025. All partners will be present, and live kick-off meeting will be held. All papers will have double-blind-review, and proofreading, and all partners will take a role of reviewers, according to their expertises. The Book of Abstract will be published at March 2025, and handbook – proceedings from Conference at May 2025. It is one of deliverables at WP1. The partners will send Invitation letter for Conference to other faculties at their countries.

2. Conducting Security and Governance Analysis

This is activity A1. 5, which will be provided through several activities:

- a) Analysis of national laws relevant for HEI and public security;
- b) Analysis of procedures, and regulations on occupational safety, fire protection, discrimination, and other risks at HEIs – it should be analyzed if different HEIs have mandatory acts about protection, and management of different risks and emergency situations;
- c) Two types of questionnaires – one for representatives of HEIs, and other one for government bodies, and local municipalities. The aim of these anonymous questionnaires is to analyse opinions about level of resilience on different security threats, and if cooperation between HEIs and state bodies exists for coordinating important risk management documents and measures.

All analyses will be prepared at form of reports, with narrative and quantitative data, by each partner. All reports will be then implemented into unique document - Report on security and governance in public spaces with reflection on HE, which is deliverable D1.4. UNTU project team prepared methodology and form of questionnaires, and uploaded it on G-Drive. Reports must be prepared by April 15 2025, and unique document by end of May 2025.

3. Webinar – Open University led (virtual) discussion

This is activity A1. 7. Each partner must organize online meeting where university/faculties representatives and experts will discuss with representatives of their society (youth, NGOs, etc), about current and possible threats. The planned discussions are intended for society representatives

with the aim of raising awareness of the project topics and objectives, engage the community through a whole-society collaborative problem-solving, and obtaining valid feedback from the community representatives at the project onset.

UNTU will organize this event, as live discussion, on May 9 2025, with main topic ‘‘Youth Violence and Schools’ Safety’’. Each partner can choose to organize discussion on one important and actual security threat at their society, or on more of them.

Webinars and reports must be done by April 15 2025, and final, unique report on all webinars must be prepared by end of May 2025.

4. Dissemination

UNTU prepared Dissemination plan (DP=, and will sent to all partners for discussion and preparation of unique DP. UNTZ is responsible for WP6 (Dissemination is one part of WP6), but UNTZ as lead of project will help with necessary methodology. All partners reminded that logo of TRUST Project must be chosen, so UNTU send 4 logo suggestions, so all partners can vote and choose the best one. UNTZ created web page about TRUST Project called ERASMUS CBHE, on official web site of Faculty of Diplomacy and Security. Other partners will give their suggestions about other forms of dissemination (web pages, banners, etc.). Also, TRUST official Facebook profile is created, and link will be send to all partners.
